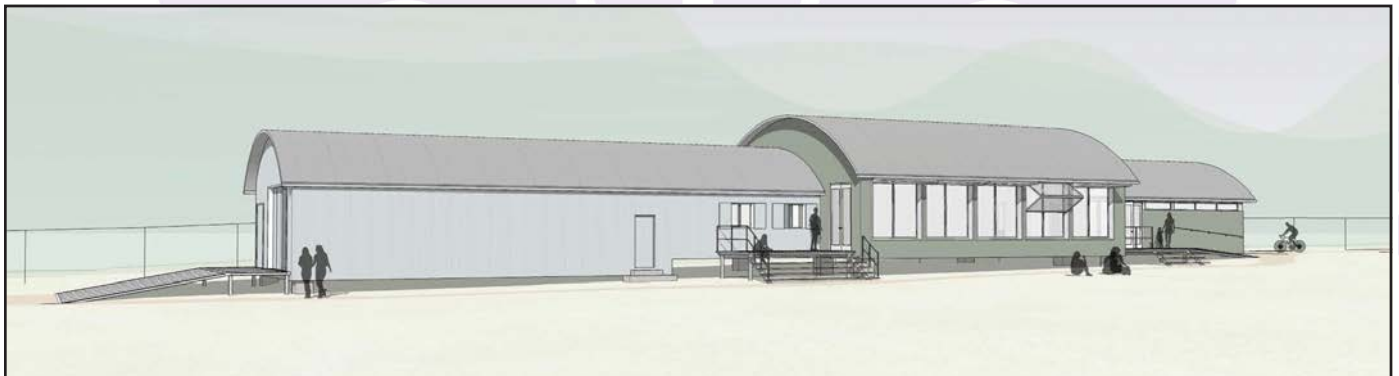

## PHOENIX RISING

WE’VE done it! After several years of negotiation, the troop have a super new Scout Hut to look forward to. Richmond Council granted planning permission for the proposed design on August 19, after overwhelming support from local residents.



**The campaign, overseen by Fiona McDaniel, saw 25 comments in support of the development, including:**

*“These new buildings will be a wonderful asset to both the current and to many future generations of Sea Scout groups. The ability to make some sense of the boat storage as well as giving the meeting space more room and light will make meetings and activities even more enjoyable for all involved.”*

*“This is a great new facility for a local Scout group. Their current building is in a sorry state of repair and if they are to continue being part of this local community they need a new building. It has been very thoughtfully designed and would secure the future of the group.”*

*“A rebuild of the Petersham and Ham Sea Scout Hut is something that has long been necessary; the group needs the space and the new facilities, especially since it now has become an extremely large group. Having separate changing rooms and toilets (as well as functional showers) is also something which would greatly benefit the group, as the facilities at the moment are barely functional for such a large group of both genders. Furthermore the additional space would benefit the Kindergarten currently in residence, giving them the space to expand their business, should they want to, or set up larger activities for the children in their care.”*

Fiona said: “It is a huge relief to know that we do not have a fight on our hands, and that we can all move on to the next stages of the project. Thanks to everyone for your support.”

Once underway, the build will see the demolition of existing Scout Hut and boat deck and replacement with stylish new Scout Hut and boat deck in same location.

## NOW WE NEED TO RAISE THE MONEY

THE Phoenix Project maybe rising but now we need to raise the cash to make it happen. The estimated cost of the project is £600,000 and to date we have £100,000 from our own funds and money promised from a local charity.

Ideally we need to raise the remaining half a million pounds within six to nine months, so let's rise to the challenge.

We have a fundraising committee in place consisting of Karin, Carole (Secretary for the Group Executive Committee) and Margit (Parent), who are keen to hear your ideas on how we can raise the cash. If you have any suggestions, please come forward and either tell the committee or your leader.

### **£140 donated to Sea Scouts for simply by sitting down and going shopping!**

I really did not have to lift a finger – well, just to click on a mouse anyway! This quarter we've raised a fabulous **£127.94** through members and their families using the Easy-Fundraising web shopping portal, with almost **£330** donated in total so far – and I've donated **£140** in total since signing up.

Well what is it and how can you get involved?

It's simple. Just log on to <http://www.easypundraising.org.uk/panel/> and register yourself under the option Petersham and Ham Sea Scouts – you will find that they are listed on the site.

You will receive a number of emails confirming your registration (you will also over the ensuing weeks get a lot of emails with offers from linked retailers – it is easy to switch these off and I have received none since). The most important message to open is the one that asks you to download the Easy Fund Raising Toolbar. This will then appear at the top of your browser window and remind you when you land on a website that supports in Easy Fund Raising and ask you whether or not you want to donate before you go shopping.

You will find that an unbelievably huge number of retailers, travel operators, utility companies and even banks come up – almost 3,000 are listed. Operations both small and large, corporate and independent support the cause (this is why it is important to have the toolbar – you just go online as normal and rather than looking up retailers who donate profits, it tells you). I am not a prolific consumer so I myself am amazed that I have raised as much as I have over the course of one year. One thing that may have led to me raising the amount I have is that I run my own business so stationery and other office supplies have contributed. Maybe your employer would be happy to raise money for us via the Easy Fund Raising website?

## Grow Your Own Tenner

Double your money without doing a thing sounds too good to be true – but you can with the Grow Your Tenner campaign.

Launching on **October 14**, charity fundraising group Localgiving will be matching one-time donations pound-for-pound up to £10, and monthly donations up to £10 per month for six months.

The Scouts and Beavers made a splash at Chatham Historic Dockyard on **Sunday September 6** with a visit to uncover attractions at the famous maritime museum. Highlights at the former Royal Navy Dockyard, which closed as a working dock in 1984, include three historic warships, a Georgian and Victorian Rope Factory called the Ropery, a recreation of the working life of the dockyard in 1785, a submarine, life boats and a smithery. Luckily as we are Sea Scouts, there were no landlubbers among us and the visit was a great success.

Patriotic P&H Sea Scouts, Beavers and Cubs took part in the annual Richmond upon Thames District St George's Day Parade on **Sunday 27 April**.
